About MyMentor

The MyMentor programme is a partnership between academics that supports a personal and professional development strategy. programme is designed to support early career researchers from the Malaysia public universities, who have completed their PhD in the last five years, to start establishing an independent research career and mentoring them to get into the habit of carrying out research and publishing the results as a normal part of their academic life. This mentoring programme pairs a mentor/ mentee for a period of 24 months or 12 months (whichever the public university senate approves).



- To mentor 230 post-doctoral early career researchers.
- To publish at least 350 high quality (i.e. ISI) papers.



- To publish at least one, preferably two, high quality (i.e. ISI) papers from each mentor/ mentee pairing.
- To enhance the researchers the profile and collaborations.
- To improve the mentees' university ranking in terms of number of publications and citations.

Why MyMentor Programme

- Mentee is allowed to work at their home university and does not require any relocation.
- Flexibility in terms of mode and numbers of meeting sessions between the mentor and mentee.
- Overseas Attachment and International Conference: the mentees have the opportunity to undertake a 3-month attachment at an international university or attend an international conference upon satisfactorily completing the annual review.
- Awareness Programme: the MyMentor team

- Annual Networking: the session for mentors and mentees to share their experiences of being on the programme.
- Feedback Session: the mentee is encouraged to attend the session as this is the platform for them to provide feedback to the Management Board.
- Seminar Series and Writing Clinic: a one day event which to be conducted centrally. It is open to all mentees and also all public universities academia within the region.
